I. Introduction

The IGAD Centre for Pastoral Areas and Livestock Development (ICPALD) was founded in July 2012 as an IGAD Specialized institution mandated to "promote and facilitate sustainable and equitable drylands and livestock development in the IGAD region". To fulfill its mandate ICPALD provides a platform for regional cooperation and coordination in drylands, fisheries and livestock development. Under the overall guidance of ICPALD Director, the resource mobilization Officer will design, and implement a strategic result-oriented and coordinated approach for the mobilization of resources from traditional and non-traditional sources including development partnerdevelopment partners, private sector organizations, foundations and any other potential sources.

III. Duties and Responsibilities

i. Support the ICPALD technical departments and the Director to develop and implement ICPALD resource mobilization strategy.

- ii. Research and analyze development partners call for funding applications including expression of interest and request for proposals
- iii. Initiate and establish relationships with traditional and non-traditional development partners and financial partners at the national, regional and international levels and lead in programmes that will facilitate this;
- iv. Lead/participate in negotiations with development partners and partners organizations on proposals, contracts, subcontracts, grants and modifications, etc. and attend relevant reporting meetings;
- v. Develop innovative approaches in mobilizing financial and non-financial resources locally and internationally and include/update this in the strategy
- vi. Participate in development of project proposals and review of all development partner proposals and budgets prior to submission;
- vii. Effectively link development partner interests with ICPALD strategic and programmatic priorities
- viii. Organize fund raising activities, such as development partners briefings and presentations or joint development partner events with relevant stakeholders
- ix. Build the capacity of staff and member state representatives in proposal writing.Grants/funds managements and reporting.
- x. Review regularly the emerging focus of the development partners; update and propose opportunities for ICPALD technical departments and the Director

IV. Minimum Qualifications and Experience

- i. A Masters Degree in Finance, Financial Management, Accounting. Business Management, Resource Mobilization, Public Private Partnership services, Agricultural Economics and/or professional accounting qualification such as CPA-K, ACCA or equivalent
- ii. Ten years work experience in and knowledge of grants management, resource mobilization; development partner contracting, monitoring of expenditure, budgeting, development partner/financial reporting.
- iii. Experience working with development partners/funding partners including EU, GCC member states, AfDB, SDC, Italian government, Scandinavian countries, USAID, DFID, World Bank, IFC, other financial institutions and/or development partners

iv. Evidence of past performance on resource mobilization and implementation with clear reference to the projects /programs involved will be an added advantage.
